Once again, our Summer School is proving to be very popular. It is still over three months away but there very few places remaining with some courses already full. If you are interested, please get your applications in soon.



AROUND THE REGION REPORTS



CUMBRIA U3A NETWORK HOSTS 2nd SUCESSFUL ENERGY CONFERENCE

Building on the success of its First Energy Conference, held in 2015, Cumbria U3A Network's Second Conference took place at Rheged near Penrith on 31st March 2017. Under the chairmanship of Professor Mike Green. experts from universities, industry and politics provided up to date evidence on topics, some controversial, relating to meeting future energy needs in a sustainable, environmentally friendly, way. The conference started by a talk on meeting the requirements of the 2015 Paris Agreement to restrict the emission of greenhouse gases, the need for which was well illustrated by the next talk on the melting of glaciers. Maintaining our electricity supply in a low carbon future was also discussed as well as the impact that fracking would have on energy production, on the local communities near the production sites, and the safety issues associated with the process. The final two talks described what local communities and individuals can do to help achieve a local carbon future. Delegates were provided with an information pack and there was also a well visited Exhibition stand staffed by Cumbria Action for Sustainability. Both of these were financed by a generous grant from Cumbria Community Foundation.

Members also had the opportunity to purchase Penrith U3A's newly published collection of papers "Climate Change and Energy". The conference was fully booked with 140 U3A members from all over Cumbria and beyond attending, and, from the feedback, they judged the conference as even more successful than the

first. Given this, Maggie Potts, the chair of the committee organising the excellent conference said that, maybe, there will be a third one in the future!

FREQUENTLY ASKED OUESTIONS



Based on a previous article in Third Age Matters, and questions I get asked when I visit U3As, I am going to try and include some Frequently Asked Questions – and their answers – in some of our future newsletters.

• Are we a club or a branch?

Neither! Each U3A is operationally independent and as there is no central U3A organisation you cannot be a branch. A club is much trickier. It is usually an organisation for people with a specific interest e.g. Bridge, Golf, Cricket, Football. Or it could be a church social club, a nightclub or a political club. U3As are Charities, which entitles them to receive donations, gift aid, access to charitable rates for room hire etc. The description of a club sometimes shares elements of the U3A philosophy so perhaps they are not mutually exclusive, but U3A has different values and our self-help ethos sets us a little apart from the occupations promoted by clubs.
