# **THEATRE** TRIPS We have had more trips to excellent plays at the **Royal Exchange Theatre** ranging



from the gritty 50s drama Saturday Night and Sunday Morning to Oscar Wilde's wonderfully witty Lady Windermere's Fan. There is one play remaining in the current season; <u>A MIDSUMMER</u> NIGHT'S DREAM - Thursday 12th July, Price: £29.50.

Stage level seats have now been reserved for plays in the next **Royal Exchange Theatre Autumn/Winter season** on the first Friday of each run at a cost of £23 per person, including transport. The price is £1 more than plays in the current season as both ticket and coach prices have

increased. (Ticket prices on Fridays are usually £30.) A minimum number of 12 people is needed to make any trip viable. The plays in the new season are:

**THE COUNTRY WIFE** – 14<sup>th</sup> September 2012 (Book and pay by 17<sup>th</sup> July);

#### **NW U3A EASTER SCHOOL 2012**

When I read about the U3A Easter School on the web site, it sounded irresistible. They had an interesting selection of courses (Archaeology, Creative Writing, Geology, An Introduction to Ancient Egypt, Novelists and Philosophers and Sixty Years of Science). I registered for Creative Writing, as did Veronica O'Connor, co-organiser of our creative writing group, and together we drove to Myerscough College, near Preston, the regular venue for these courses. We had an excellent and very experienced tutor, Maggie Smith, whose first words were that we were there to work. And work we did – up to six hours a day in class for two and a half days. Maggie gave us many useful tips on how to get started as well as enhanced confidence in our writing. Some fine pieces were produced and every one of us went away with the feeling that we had made progress as well as a renewed belief in our potential as writers.

The college campus is impressive, but, sadly, the weather turned cold and windy that week. I would have enjoyed a visit to the gardens. The first evening, we had a lively Gardeners' Question Time with a member of the horticulture department and, the following evening, a quiz which our team won. The College bar is in the appropriately named Stumble Inn. Accommodation is in single en suite rooms and the food is, for institutional catering, surprisingly good! The price -£185 – was all-inclusive for the two nights we spent there and we considered it extremely good value.

We hope that, next year, more Poynton members will consider attending the Easter school. Apart from the stimulating courses, it's a great opportunity to relax and get to know members from all over the region and learn about their experiences in U3A. I'm sure I'll be back!


