#### Bird Watching Group

#### Trip to Marshside RSPB Reserve at Southport in April

10 of us arrived at Marshside RSPB in beautifully clear, if bracing, weather. We were very grateful to the RSPB warden, Alex Piggott, for introducing us to the reserve on our arrival, giving us some of its history, and indicating what we might expect to see on the day. We were also grateful, that she was able to accompany us and give us the benefit of her expertise in the morning when we walked along Marine Drive for views across the reserve towards Polly's Pool. Flocks and individual waders were seen with star birds; Black-tailed Godwit, Golden Plover and Avocet.

After a picnic lunch taken in the Soundgrounder Hide and Visitor Centre, we viewed Rimmer's Marsh from Nel's Hide and Marshside Road, from which we also had views back across the main reserve. We left for home at around 3pm, beating the weather as it closed in.

Our species list (for which many thanks to Viv Arnold) showed, of the waders:- Avocet, Gadwall, Black-tailed Godwit, Golden Plover, Redshank, Shoveler, Oystercatcher, Common Sandpiper, Snipe, Dunlin, Ruff and Ringed Plover. Other species seen were:- Little Egret, Pied Wagtail, Lapwing, Skylark, Kestrel, Pink-footed Goose, Black-headed Gull, Tufted Duck, Coot, Starling, Shelduck, Moorhen, Pipit, Swans, Woodpigeon and Swallows.


