#### NORTH EAST CHESHIRE NETWORK - OPEN GROUPS

Poynton U3A has joined with four other local U3As, Bramhall, Wilmslow, Cheadle Hulme and Cheadle and Gatley, to form the North East Cheshire Network of U3As. Importantly, the network recognises **OPEN GROUPS**. This means that any group, that cannot manage to attract enough people from their own U3A to make it viable, has the option of opening up its activities to members of the other U3As in the network. Any member of the five participating U3As can join an Open Group by showing their current U3A membership card. Of course, if you want to join a group that is not on the open list you will have to become a member of the U3A that runs that particular group.
