### **New Microphones**

Cheshire East

The support of Cheshire East Council, which has graciously provided a grant of £500, has allowed Poynton U3A to purchase a range of equipment to support its meetings in the Civic Centre. To date this includes a robust stand for a projector and laptop, a radio microphone and a mixer, through which sound from lap top presentations and the radio microphone can now be relayed through the induction loop system in the main hall and thus become available to those in the audience wishing to tune in hearing aids. This new equipment will shortly be set up in the Civic Hall and will then become available to groups using the building under the authority of staff of the Civic Hall.


